Key aims of the role	<p>From 25<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> October 2016, Edinburgh hosts the 23<sup>rd</sup> Rehabilitation International (RI) World Congress. Nature of the Shaw Trust project	<p>Shaw Trust is a national charity that helps people facing disadvantage into work, to gain skills and take control of their futures. We work at the heart of communities across Britain, developing back-to-work programmes, providing learning and skills initiatives and changing society to better help those facing disadvantage. Last year we supported over 50,000 people on their journey into work.</p> <p>Over 1000 delegates from around the world are expected to attend the conference, many of whom may be disabled people. As a volunteer your main role will be to contribute towards the overall experience of our visitors. You will be part of a team that will ensure that the final stage of the delegates' journey to the conference is smooth, they receive a warm welcome to the city and their needs are met over the duration of the event.</p>
Main duties	<p>This is varied opportunity where you will be allocated a role within the main conference venue, the Edinburgh International Conference Centre (EICC) that matches your skills, experience or area of interest, including:</p> <p><b>Edinburgh Ambassadors</b>  Passionate about what the great city of Edinburgh has to offer visitors and want to share your local knowledge with delegates? Join us as an ambassador and provide local advice and guidance for delegates wishing to explore Edinburgh and beyond. Part of this role may involve supporting delegates to external site or project visits.</p>



	<p><b>Welcome Hosts</b> Help ensure that delegates receive a warm welcome and excellent customer service as they arrive at the EICC. Volunteer to welcome delegates and support them with registration and signposting as required.</p> <p><b>Delegate Support Volunteer</b> Use your organisational and problem-solving skills to help run the conference helpdesk and deal with face to face and telephone enquiries. Ensure as a 'go to' person for delegates who need support, (for example, during meals/breaks and accessing the mobility scooter provision) you are on hand to organise assistance.</p> <p><b>Guide Dog Area Volunteer</b> Animal lovers wanted! Help to look after the needs of delegates guide dogs while onsite.</p> <p><b>Mass Drummers</b> Some volunteers may also be asked to be part of a team to help organise a mass drumming event as the last session of the conference.</p> <p>Or join us in one or more roles above and offer your support in a range of ways over the course of the conference.</p>
